HUGE INTEREST FOR ECTP PROGRAMME

More than 150 students have registered for the new European Citizenship Trimester Programme (ECTP), which will be launched for the first time this year.


At the end of the trimester exchange, participants from Italy, Russia, Austria, Spain, Latvia. Croatia, Belgium Flanders, Belgium French, Czech Republic, Switzerland, Hungary, Bosnia Portugal, and Germany, will gather in Brussels for the climax of the programme: the EFIL End-of-Stay camp from 22nd to 26th November 2009. In workshops and sessions they will reflect on their experience as well as issues like European citizenship and integration, diversity in Europe, volunteering and participation, intercultural learning. Communication with the European Union is ongoing to secure a visit to the European Parliament and/or the European Commission for all the camp participants. Not an obvious every day request for a group of over 150...

This idea of bringing all participants together in the capital of Europe, will be a substantial added value to the trimester for students stay all involved, and will emphasize the European dimension of their exchange term. Preparation modules focusing on European integration and identity are being developed by EFIL for use volunteers in the countries for orientations before and during the stay.

Meanwhile, EFIL has made a booking reservation at a very suitable place near Brussels that can easily accommodate the large group of participating youngsters.

TWO MONTHS TO EFIL'S GENERAL ASSEMBLY

It's only two more months before the EFIL member organisations will get together in Moscow for the Federation's biennial General Assembly, kindly hosted by AFS Russia. Good progress has been made in preparing for what promises to be an interesting programme.

Being faced with the pressing challenge of how to best equip Europeans with the skills and competences they need in their future in a competitive, globalised and knowledge-based Europe, we all agree that a period spent abroad is a most valuable experience for the individuals involved.

The venue will be the Atlas Park Hotel, a modern hotel, located in a picturesque place of Domodedovsky District of Moscow region, some 29 km from the Moscow ring road, and a mere 15 minutes drive from

The GA officially opens with the dinner on Thursday 21st May and ends on Sunday morning 24th May. Prior to the GA, on Thursday, there will be our first Heads of Office meeting of the year. Following the GA, AFS Russia offers two more optional activities for participants: a Moscow sightseeing tour on Sunday 24th May, plus a great opportunity to experience a home stay with a Russian host family for two nights.

BOARD ELECTIONS COMING UP

This is just a reminder that the deadline is approaching submission of candidacies for the EFIL Board elections. Nominations need to by e-mail at the EFIL Secretariat in Brussels no later than 22nd March, addressed to the Chair the Election Committee. On Saturday 23rd May, during EFIL's extraordinary General Assembly, the vote counting will take place for three two-year mandates and one one-year mandate on the EFIL Board Soon Directors. afterwards, through the EFIL office, the Election Committee will inform the Member Organisations candidacies of all received.

TRAINING ON ORGANISATIONAL DEVELOPMENT IN CROATIA COMING UP SOON

A tough, competitive recruitment of participants for the upcoming EFIL training course "Youth Participation through Organisational Development" has been concluded, defining a group of 27 volunteers from 14 countries.

The main focus of the event is the development of new organisations in

the AFS exchange world, in particular those in the Balkans. A mentorship system has been put into place allowing the new organisations to learn from experienced AFS Partners. The recruited participants include most of all these new organisations and the existing AFS countries involved in supporting them.

The event will take place from 4-11 April 2009, just outside Zagreb, Croatia, hosted by the growing exchange organisation in that country, called Globus – Association for Intercultural Learning.

INVITATION TO APPLY FOR AN EFIL SEMINAR IN DENMARK FOCUSED ON RE-ENTRY ORIENTATIONS

Another interesting EFIL training is opening the application procedure for participants!

The seminar "The challenge of returning home putting intercultural competences into practice after long-term educational exchanges" will aim to analyse the practices existing of returnee processes in the AFS world and look for ways to improve them. Starting the current practices different National Organisations, the seminar will focus on reflecting about the role of re-orientation in the AFS context and in lifelong learning processes. The training will take place in the Viking city of Roskilde, about 30 Denmark, km Copenhagen, from May 10th to May 16th 2009. The event is funded by the European Youth Foundation of the Council of Europe.

The preparatory team of the seminar, consisting of Yves Gheysen (AFS BFR), Inga Menke (AFS GER), Yonathan Darmon (AFS FRA), Karin Bitterli (AFS SUI/ EFIL) and EFIL Training Co-ordinator Izabela Jurczik, met last weekend in Brussels to discuss the program and plan the details of the event.

Participants of the seminar will be recruited through a call, which has been sent to national AFS offices. All candidates are expected to apply before the deadline on **April 14**th – be in time!

REFRESHMENT OF THE EPOT

European Pool of Trainers (EPOT), established in 2002, is the common training resource for all EFIL For members. European training EPOT is a source of relevant and competences, diverse ensuring recruitment smooth and fair

For trainers' teams. Member Organisations it is not only a guarantee of higher quality EFIL training events but also a good way of improving local and national activities (new skills acquired by EPOT trainers, Travelling **Trainers** opportunity...). Finally, for trainers themselves EPOT gives a unique chance to gain new skills, travel, get to know different training contexts (also outside AFS) and have an impact on the European training reality. In the past EPOT membership allowed many experienced volunteer trainers keep up their development, motivation and involvement in AFS.

The EPOT is now being renewed for the next two-year period. The EFIL Member Organisations are therefore invited to nominate trainers (there is no limit for a number of trainers) for EPOT by March 26th 2009. The call for nominations has been sent to all EFIL Member Organisations with a detailed explanation of the EPOT members' roles and of recruitment procedure please contact your office for further information.

For those organisations that do not manage to nominate candidates in this refreshment round but might have potentially interested trainers in the near future, there will be more chances to nominate EPOT members coming up every 6 months.

EXPLORING NEW OPPORTUNITIES GRUNDTVIG APPLICATION

For the 27th February deadline EFIL submitted a funding application for a project under the Lifelong Learning Programme (LLP) of the European Commission. The Grundtvig project entitled "Intercultural Learning in Family Life" will open new horizons for AFS to establish strategic relations with institutions and

organisations with similar fields of activity – intercultural learning, volunteering and non-formal education.

In particular, this new undertaking will focus on educational support for families involved in the intercultural long-term exchange programmes. The project will collect and exchange existing educational tools from the project partners' networks and will promote their use within the own organisation to provide better and more diverse trainings for host families.

application will get the Commission's approval and the activities all develop as planned, the AFS network will end up having access to an online database of educational methods to be used for activities with families which will the work of hosting coordinators in particular.

EFIL will keep you posted on how the selection process goes and hopefully we'll be able to turn this endeavor into a successful experience for the wider AFS community!

EUROPEAN YEAR OF CREATIVITY AND INNOVATION — THE LOGO

The logo can be read both as sparks and synapses, elements that are considered powerful symbols innovation and creativity. While sparks evoke an unpredictable event or changing situation, synapses stand for links between different elements, connect ideas, or universes. The shape resembles a star, which helps identify the Year as an EU initiative. The logo of the previous European Year is similar in that it combines a simple coloured shape with a claim in black and white.

The 8 visuals elements represent the 8 key competences to improve:

- I. Communication in the mother tongue;
- Communication in foreign languages;
- Mathematical competence and basic competences in science and technology;
- 4. Digital competence;
- 5. Learning to learn;
- 6. Social and civic competences;
- 7. Sense of initiative and entrepreneurship; and
- 8. Cultural awareness and expression.

EFIL is getting a lot of requests from partner organisations for extra copies of the DVD "Snapshots - When Cultures

Interact". As you recall, producing the DVD was a project in the framework of the European Year of Intercultural Dialogue 2008. 'snapshot movies', three short fiveminute videos, filmed in Belgium, Germany and Portugal, demonstrate impact of intercultural experiences, with the intention to generate discussions leading to more extended intercultural awareness. Additionally, there's a 25-minute documentary which looks into the concept of culture, through prominent interviews with practitioners in the field Professor intercultural learning: Geert Hofstede, Dr. Milton Bennett and Dr. Roberto Ruffino. The movies are to be used for intercultural education in schools for secondary school students and during workshops for pupils leaving for an intercultural exchange.
