STUDY ABROAD

Living and studying in another country, for periods up to 9 months, while developing intercultural skills, acquiring new languages, gaining maturity, independence and self-efficacy.

Not a year ago I was a child that thought she knew everything and now I'm a girl that is pretty sure she knows nothing. And yes some of it I had to learn the hard way. 
EXPLORE AWARDS


