





Dear Potential Host Family,

Following the 1994 elections, a new South Africa was born. Since the inauguration of Nelson Mandela and democracy, South Africa became a cultural melting pot and a popular tourist destination. People of all ages and from countries around the world are curious about our nation that made a peaceful transition from Apartheid to a Democratic society.

AFS Interculture South Africa provides a safe means for young people to experience life in this country: to enjoy our multi-cultural society, learn our languages, study in our school system, enjoy the beauty of the country, and most importantly to live with a caring host family. AFS Interculture South Africa places participants in host families of all cultures, in towns and cities throughout the country. Although many parts of the country are affected by crime, AFS Interculture South Africa only places a participant in an area that is considered safe.

Not only does hosting allow for the development of a relationship with a young person from another culture, but it also provides for intercultural learning without the expense of travelling abroad. Not to mention the ability to develop friendships with other families who host participants, and to become a part of the AFS family and facilitate the peace process in South Africa by sharing information about lifestyles and learning about new cultures.

AFS is recognised throughout the world for our support of programme participants and families. Support comes to you and your family in the form of a 24 hour Emergency contact number, a National Office in which staff are trained to give support to families and students. Preparation orientation also form part of our training provided to students before departure in their home country as well as an arrival orientation and an orientation at the middle and the end of the programme in South Africa. The host family receives a handbook with information important for taking up the role of hosting an exchange student. While Volunteer Chapters (where applicable) provide support and may organise social events for the participant to make sure that some of the students and your own concerns or great experiences are handled with efficiency and care and documented respectively.

AFS Interculture South Africa covers the costs of medical insurance, school fees, within reason, AFS organised orientations, and domestic travel to your town or city. Students and their natural parents are responsible for winter and summer school uniform, extra mural activities, eye care, dental care, medical care for pre-existing conditions before the AFS exchange year, preventive medicine, visa application cost, long distance phone calls, entertainment expenses and pocket money. As a family we ask that you take only the responsibility of the accommodation (according to AFS regulations, all participants must have their own bed) and food for your participants.

Joining our family means that your act of volunteerism will not go unnoticed. Your impact on this young life changes preconceptions about South Africa and who we are as a people.

We thank you for committing to our cause and hope to hear from you about your experiences soon,
