ECTP 2010

107 young people, 13 countries, more than 20 spoken languages, 4 days of workshops, a team of 20 committed AFS volunteers, 900 sandwiches & many bottles of water, a lot of cubic meters of rain and dozens of fun... These were just some of the ingredients of last year's pilot Brussels Camp of the European Citizenship Trimester Programme. Following the great success of the memorable first Brussels Camp in November 2009, the 2nd edition of this event has already entered its planning phase!

What do we expect? The camp will take place between 28 November and 2 December 2010 in Brussels and according to the initial estimates as communicated by our AFS partners, it will gather around 165 students from all over Europe after they come back from their trimester exchange to another European country. The young people will be accommodated in the by now famous and beloved Destelheide educational centre, perfectly adapted to the needs of the Camp and the students. As last year, we are planning visits to the European institutions so that ECTP participants can get the ultimate feeling of being in the heart of Europe.

Having gathered feedback and evaluation from offices, the Camp team, volunteers and participants, there are a good number of new ideas that we want to develop for the upcoming ECTP camp - we are looking forward to make it an inspiring activity that attracts great public attention!

The preparatory team for the 2010 Camp will be formed soon, following a call for members.

Thanks to the many hours and the great work put into the preparation of this study session by the team, things went smoothly and participants could enjoy a well planned programme providing them with many opportunities to exchange ideas and views.

GOOD PROGRESS IN EURAFRICAN PARTNERSHIP FOR CHANGE

Good progress has been made in the EFIL project “EURAFRICAN PARTNERSHIP FOR CHANGE”. The project, sponsored by the European Commission, aims at empowering our African network partners, and perfectly fits in with the AFS network’s increased focus on Africa as seen in the AFS Vision 2020 and the discussions on network priorities at the World Congress in Kuala Lumpur last October.



Twenty-four experienced volunteers from twelve European AFS organisations (Austria, Belgium Flanders, Denmark, Spain, Finland, Germany, Hungary, Iceland, Italy, Latvia and Portugal) and three African partners (Ghana, South Africa and Kenya) will travel to Africa in the first half of 2010, where they will be involved in feasibility studies and trainings aimed at volunteers and staff in the three participating African countries. In a week-long closing seminar in Vienna, Austria, in August 2010, all participants will get together to share their experiences.

Meanwhile, all participants have been selected, and project preparations are ongoing. Our African partners have given input regarding their training needs, and a training programme is being developed.

As you can see, our search for a logo has been successful. The magnificent design above is a creation from Fabio Villa, AFS Volunteer in the Italian Monza chapter. COMENIUS PROJECT – TEACHER TRAINING ON PUPIL EXCHANGES

In 2010 the European Commission Lifelong Learning Programme starts the first secondary school pupil exchanges under the Comenius Sub-programme. EFIL and its Member Organisations aim at exploring the possible role of AFS in this new European Programme. Providing training possibilities and offering expertise to schools and teachers, are potential services that can be offered by AFS organisations.

This is where the idea of a large-scale initiative, hopefully to be supported by the Lifelong Learning EU scheme, came on to the agenda. Together with 7 AFS organisations (Austria, Czech Republic, Denmark, France, Germany, Italy and Portugal) and in co-operation with ESHA (European School Heads Association), EFIL is preparing a proposal for a Multilateral Project to last almost 2 years in 2011-2012.

The core of this project is the organisation of national teacher training events on youth exchanges in the 7 project countries. Each national training course will be in the language of the project country. A group of travelling international trainers will assist at the national training events and ensure common standards. The training events will be documented and evaluated, resulting in a Training Package for each country. This Training Package will be used to assist schools on a more regular basis in the years to come. A European

Teachers' Seminar in 2012 will provide teachers with the opportunity to share ideas and experiences about youth exchanges, intercultural education and the Comenius Pupil Exchange scheme.

EFIL will be the main coordinator of the project, yet there are many tasks which will be carried out by the involved AFS organisations. They will be responsible for the organisation and execution of the national training events and packages, as well as the recruitment of trainers and participants for national events.

ICL SEMINAR

Many you have already noticed this event in the training events overview for 2010 - it is great to see the interest raised by the project already!

The idea of the seminar is to bring together about 25 participants - volunteers and staff from within AFS network (primarily from Europe) who deal with Intercultural Learning educational frameworks within the organisation. In brief, we aim at the ICL experts in Partner Organisations, who work conceptually on our approaches, are members of ICL Task Forces and such-like, are involved in external co-operations on this topic, have additional educational background in ICL, etc.

The 5 days of the seminar will focus on a deep a reflection and debate on the AFS situation in ICL, in addition

to a look at external developments in the field. It is planned to include:

- an overview of our own expertise and internal resources;
- a look at the work done by other NGO, institutional and academic players in the field (possibly identifying synergies);
- critical discussion about our own educational frameworks and approaches;
- conclusions for future actions resulting from the above.

Interactive working methods will be chosen to maximise exchange of practices, opinions and peer learning - hence the profile of the targeted participants group.

- Mark Taylor (external freelance trainer, expert in intercultural education and youth work, co-author of Council of Europe T-Kits)
- Izabela Jurczik (EFIL's Training Co-ordinator and the overall co-ordinator of the project)

The project involves also other prominent AFS figures as advisors - among others, the members of the ICL Work Group Dr. Roberto Ruffino (AFS Italy and Chair of the Board of EFIL) and Annette Gisevius (AFS Germany). In addition, external experts/guests from the ICL field will be invited to give input during the seminar itself.

The Preparatory team will meet in person in Brussels in the first days of March, to work out the details of the seminar programme. The call for participants, with exact information about the profile expected, participation fees and practical issues, will be sent out in February.

The call for registrations, including the final information about the participation fees, is planned to be issued in April/May. In the meantime EFIL is pursuing opportunities for external funding for the event, to keep the fee at a very reasonable level.

PARTNER NEWS

In each edition of EFILife, we dedicate some space to partner news, including personnel changes as well as relevant events that have taken place over the past month.

AFS Czech Republic is happy to announce that they have received financial support from the European Social Fund (through the Ministry of Education of Czech Republic) to do workshops on intercultural learning at schools, as a three year project for the total of 150.000 USD. **AFS Belgium French** has entered a new

partnership with its Youth National Agency allowing Community Service Programme candidates to apply for a partial scholarship of up to 1.800 Euro per participant.

Promoting the Nordic region cooperation, last December **AFS Sweden** hosted a Nordic staff meeting with participants from Norway, Denmark and Finland. They met in Stockholm, and the focus was on sharing knowledge and expertise, best practices on sending, hosting, support and volunteer development, and strengthening relationships between the Nordic partners.

AFS India welcomed the second batch of teachers from Denmark under the Teacher Exchange programme which has been initiated by **AFS Denmark**. Indian teachers had come to Denmark

in August 2009 for 3 months. AFS Denmark's teacher exchange programme is with India, China and Turkey. And there's more international news about AFS Denmark. Just before Christmas, Morten Sivertsen (former Chair of the Board of AFS Denmark) and Lene Godiksen (Programme Director) went to Kenya to train a group of Kenyan volunteers and Board members.

In December, **AFS Tunisia** organised a two day cultural orientation for all year programme participants aiming at enabling them to associate with the local culture and to become familiar and comfortable with local rituals and customs. Included were a visit to the Tunisian National School of the Arts of Circus, a tour in the old city, a visit to a cinema school and to the Technological Park of "Ghazella".

AFS Turkey announced that their annual Summer Programme will include a special option this summer. The regular programme begins on June 28 and participants will stay with Turkish families until 8 August. A second programme will be on offer, which includes 2 week-long camps between home stays with **CADDEBOSTAN**

(www.caddebostan.org), a very experienced partner and member of International Camping Fellowship.

AFS Switzerland has re-launched their new website: afs.ch. The site is available in German and will soon be translated in French too. Late December, **AFS Latvia** moved to a new office. The new address: AFS Latvia, Blaumana Str 38/40, Riga, LV-1011, Latvia. Phones and e-mail addresses remain the same.



Time to focus on some staff updates now. **AFS Spain** is proud to present its new Partner Director, Juan Luis Carril Cuesta. Since 4 January he joined the staff in the Madrid office. In its

message to the AFS network the Board of AFS Spain adds a special word of thanks to Marcel Krause and the staff team for their much appreciated work during the transition months the organisation went through. SUMMER ACADEMY AFS GERMANY

In the summer of 2010 the first "Summer Academy on Intercultural Experience" will take place in Karlsruhe, in the south of Germany. It will be cooperatively organized by Karlshochschule – International University and AFS Germany. It approaches relevant topics in the field of intercultural management and communication and is intended to foster the intercultural perspective within the field of management theory as well as to develop applied solutions for the problems in business and society.

The Summer Academy will last three weeks (16 August – 3 September 2010) and students can enrol for either two or three weeks. The academy will offer lectures on Intercultural Communication, Intercultural Management, Cultures and Conflicts, European Cultural Studies, Intercultural Training and Coaching as well as Intercultural Teams and Leadership.

All courses will include workshop sessions with complementary theoretical and practical content offered by academic staff and AFS-trainers which are experts with large experience in international environments.

For the AFS network the Summer Academy offers several unique possibilities: AFS volunteers and staff can use this opportunity for their own further education; special early bird prices for AFSers are available as well as scholarship options; undergraduate students can obtain up to six European credit points for their participation; experienced AFS-trainers can multiply their knowledge at the Summer Academy. In a team with a faculty member they will teach one of the 5-day courses.

AFS EGYPT PARTICIPATING IN ANNA LINDH FORUM IN BARCELONA

AFS Egypt has been chosen for an ALF-sponsored participation in the "Anna Lindh Forum 2010", to be held in Barcelona, Spain, on 4-7 March 2010.

Their project, the Intercultural Peace Caravan, which was partially funded by the Anna Lindh Foundation among the 1001 actions of 2008, was selected to be presented. The project was an initiative put together by AFS Egypt and involved a group of 42 youth of different nationalities. In a bus they toured 7 cities in Egypt, each time stopping for a day or two, allowing the participants on the caravan to visit the city and interact with local youth in workshops, presentations, community service, this way creating a platform for communication. The Peace Caravan focused on the importance of intercultural learning as a key tool in promoting understanding and ultimately peace. The purpose was to empower the youth, and make them realize that peace is something they can create, promote and make happen.

The Anna Lindh Forum 2010 is a major civil society gathering for the promotion of intercultural action across the Mediterranean region organized by the Anna Lindh Foundation in partnership with the European Institute of the

Mediterranean, Head of the ALF Spanish Network.

The Forum aims to give new momentum to the cooperation among civil society organisations committed to intercultural dialogue in the Union for the Mediterranean region and to enrich the activities of the forty-three National Networks of the Anna Lindh Foundation.

FOCUS ON AFS BELGIAN FLANDERS

In every issue of EFILife, we put the spotlight on one of EFIL's Member Organisations. With the limited space available, focus will be on the organisational structure. This month we give the floor to AFS Belgium Flanders.



In August 2009 AFS-Belgium Flanders (BFL) got a new Chair and a new National Director. Enough to cause a lot of turbulences in the organisation, you would think. Of course these changes did not pass without being noticed, but BFL could continue on the paths which had been taken the years before. Partners who work with AFS BFL can still rely on the quality that has been guaranteed in the past.

The main change came in the organisation of the staff structure. Marcel Kerff, the new National Director, confirmed Helga Schepers as Programme Director and Kaat Niels as the head of the Financial Department. The structure of the other sections has been changed. They are now grouped together as

the 'Organisation Development Team' (ODT), with Griet Labee as the team Director, and the Programme Team (PT), which is composed of a section responsible for the school programmes and another section dealing with 18+-programmes. Here we also find the staff members responsible for counselling and for travel. In the ODT several people are working on communication, external as well as internal. Others are concentrating on volunteer development. Also the reception and the office management section can be found here. Last but not least, the Financial Department keeps an eye on the organisation's revenues and expenses.

Through this reorganisation the team of BFL is ready to answer the challenges and to work towards the realisation of Vision 2020. In the past AFS BFL was a front runner in many new initiatives and it is ready to continue in that direction. At the same time the consolidation of the quality in all the programmes and services will be the target. Their motto: "only if our clients and our partners are satisfied, we are satisfied...".
